

FILMING GUIDELINES

The following filming guidelines MUST be adhered to at all times. Exceptions may be applied depending on certain circumstances and must be approved by the brand's PR team in HQ:

For the avoidance of doubt, filming is only permitted when an approved Royal Caribbean representative is present.

- No filming in crew areas;
- No filming in the engine room;
- No filming in the galley during service hours;
- No filming in the medical facility;
- No filming of medical processes such as medical care, testing, evacuations, etc.
- No interviews with crew unless explicitly approved and a Cruise Line PR representative is present;
- No interviews with crew regarding gratuities or compensation;
- No filming in the casino. If permission is granted, no close-up shots are allowed;
- Filming on the bridge is only allowed with permission of the Master and when a Cruise Line PR representative is present;
- No filming of security or boarding procedures or check-in process this includes SeaPass swiping, X-ray machines, health questionnaires, muster drill etc.;
- No filming of muster/safety drills, safety briefings or announcements, fire or safety systems test alarms.
- For filming in the dining room, only wide shots are allowed. There should be no close-up shots of
 people eating or shots of specific tables of dining guests unless the participants have given prior
 approval;
- Film crews are allowed to film part of the entertainment shows and parades but only 20 seconds of footage may be used for broadcast;
- No filming of children without a signed release from the child's parents;
- All cables and cords must be secured/covered to ensure guests' safety.
- Any unauthorized or unlicensed drone filming/photography needs separate approval from the brand, as well as the relevant location authority.
- When filming on land when the vessel is in port, all parties must be back by the vessel's deadline (usually an hour before sailing) otherwise the vessel will not wait.
- Any filming on land is subject to the Producer and Producer's Personnel getting advance

approval from the relevant port authority.
