These new initiatives, which are being kicked off in Vanuatu and will then launch globally, are designed to connect local students with cruise tourism and maritime careers. Offering immersive ship tours and hands-on learning experiences onboard Royal Caribbean ships, the program supports the company's commitment to community engagement and environmental stewardship.

Royal Voyagers is tailored for primary school students to learn about life at sea through fun and
interactive activities. Students will have the opportunity to tour a Royal Caribbean ship, learn

Royal Mariners, designed for secondary school students, will provide a deeper dive into
maritime operations and sustainability. Students will have the chance to meet key crew
members such as the Environmental Officer as well as visit areas such as the Waste
 Management Centre and Engine Control Room. Students will also learn about career pathways
available in the cruise industry.

The first activity took place on 24 November with **Saint Joseph Primary School in Port Vila** when *Anthem of the Seas* made her return to Vanuatu to mark the start of the summer season.

"We are thrilled that students will have a unique opportunity to step onboard Royal Caribbean's Anthem of the Seas," said **Nanise Lapi**, Director, Department of Education. "Programs like Royal Caribbean's Royal Voyagers and Royal Mariners programs help children understand the importance of cruise tourism and sustainability for our islands."
